75. TIMES SQUARE ENTERTAINMENT, Katy, Texas. You don't have to go to Las Vegas to experience a faux New York. You'll find images of the Big Apple throughout this 36-lane center — even on the concourse tables.

76. BOWL-A-RAMA, Rowlett, Texas. The winner of the “Best New Center” award in *BJI's* 2004 Architecture & Design Awards competition has 26 lanes, an upscale billiards room and many other amenities. The management takes pride in getting to know regular customers by name.

77. SOUTH MILWAUKEE ARCADE, Milwaukee, Wis. This 10-laner has been in business for 80 years, serving generations of neighborhood families — all of whom have had to side-step the posts in the approach area.

78. INCREDIBLE DAVE'S, Louisville, Ky. In the mood for a friendly wager with

your bowling buddy? At Incredible Dave's, the loser might be sentenced to the facility's Sky High Euro-Bungee. If bungee jumping isn't your thing, perhaps the loser

could buy dinner. We recommend the applewood bacon-wrapped pork medallions.

79. PINZ, Milford, Mass. There's some kind of special

available every day of the week, from “NFL Sunday Ticket” games beamed into the Blue Dog Sports Bar & Grille during the football season, to an “Arcade Happy Hour” when games of the electronic variety can be played for half-price. Top local bands also perform weekly.

80. ACME BOWLING/BILIARDS/EVENTS, Tukwila, Wash. Two adjoining warehouses were combined and retrofitted to create this space, which has been described as urban-industrial, modern and sleek. One “wing” of the facility has 30 lanes for public bowling, while the other has 10 lanes in a private lounge known as Seven 10. Lane-side food and beverage service is offered throughout.
